SAMARITANUS BONUS

In 2020, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith published the letter Samaritanus bonus ("on the care of persons in the critical and terminal phases of life"). The Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities produced several resources, available in both English and Spanish, to accompany this letter (usccb.org/prolife/catholic-care-sick-and-dying).



Samaritanus bonus: Study Guide

This study guide is designed to be used in group settings to discuss and reflect on Samaritanus bonus. It can be used in conjunction with either "Samaritanus bonus: A Compendium" or with the full letter. This study guide provides Scripture passages, prayers, and discussion questions to help participants reflect more deeply on the letter and its central themes and teachings.



Samaritanus bonus: A Compendium

This compendium contains summaries of each section of Samaritanus bonus and was prepared by the secretariat to serve as a resource on and introduction to the letter. It can be used on its own or in conjunction with the study guide.
